

Slam Poetry Script Submission Form

Script Submission Form Purpose: Slam Poetry speech scripts should contain the exact text of the student's speech for accountability. The sources of any contributing information must be formally cited so that credit is given where credit is due. The script preparation instructions below will assist with that process.

- 1. The student must submit a typewritten copy of the speech. The script should be typed exactly as it will be presented.
- 2. All sources and authors must be orally cited in the introduction near the beginning of the speech. This includes self-authored poems.
- 3. All direct quotations <u>must be underlined</u>.
- 4. In-text (parenthetical) citations must be added after direct quotations.
- 5. A Citation Page must be created on a separate page at the end of the speech. Any format is acceptable. (Students may use www.easybib.com or other applications to assist with the Citation Page.) All sources must be included on the Citation Page.
- 6. Unpublished works must have written permission from the author; a copy of this permission must be included with the script.
- 7. A current Script Submission Form must be submitted with the speech script at each tournament.

If for some reason the competitor is unable to comply with the script submission requirements, or if the competitor is missing some required element, a brief explanation should be attached to the Script Submission Form for consideration by tournament administration. No student should be disqualified from tournament competition due to a script formatting error.
